Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) is defined as research being carried out with or by members of the public rather than to, about or for them.

WHY PPI?

Well implemented PPI can facilitate the conduct of relevant and accessible research, resulting in innovative and impactful solutions to healthcare challenges



The course includes the following themes:

- What is PPI, and what is it not?
- How to apply PPI to your own research (including both pre-clinical and clinical research)
- How to practically apply PPI throughout the research lifecycle
- What are barriers and facilitators to conducting good PPI
- How to critically evaluate the impact of PPI
